The League's Voter Services Committee formulated the questions; the responses may be viewed at www.lwv-lafayette.org. Voters are encouraged to use this valuable resource in making their decisions before election day.

City-Parish Council candidates Sam Doré and Max Jordan, both Republicans, answered the League's questions on a wide range of local issues such as traffic, safety, development, drainage, sewage, public transportation, parks and green spaces, funding for the Lafayette in a Century Plan and bike paths.

Senatorial candidates Elbert L. Guillory and Patricia Cravens answered questions concerning key state issues such as Louisiana's high school dropouts, protection for the state's wetlands, funding for highway transportation, and health care for the state's uninsured.
